## AFRICA

### West Africa

Mercs: 10mc, 10mi

### THE AKA'MURRID EMIRATE OF FULANI

Maleek, Emir of the Fulani

DIPLOMACY: Kanuri(t), Daza(t), Zerma(nt), Mandara(c), Senegal(ea), Ghana(nt)

Maleek blamed Togo for the Igbo and apologized to the representatives of Congo with a gift attached. But it was too late. Argabak lifted the garrison from Igbo and with 38,000 infantry attacked Ife. The Togo were asleep and didn't respond. It was easily pacified. While that was happening a vengeful Congo

army crossed the Benue River to attack Gwari. Gwari was looted and was then left abandoned. A garrison of 4000 had been killed.

In the savannahs between Gao and Ngazargumu, cities were founded. In Daza, Umfulu was built. At Kanuri, Matata arose from the plains. The Ghana ally died in Senegal. His successor wants minimal involvement with Fulani.

### THE SUPREMACY OF TOGO

Kutoba

DIPLOMACY: none

The Fulani attacked Ife, but Winye didn't know what to do about it. The Togo king got sick from some fever in 1335 and died late that year. His younger brother Kutoba succeeded him. Perhaps some resolve will be had then.

### THE BANTU KINGS OF KONGO

Akashua, King of Ba-Congo

DIPLOMACY: Igbo(t), Benin(ea)

Akashua's sent an instrument of vengeance, Zweithini, and a heavily armored army north to deal with the Fulani. They had abandoned Igbo for greener trees. But it didn't matter, Akashua's will must be followed despite distractions of booty and wine. Gwari was attacked, stripped of its public works and left to rot. The 26,500 men retired to Igbo to whoop up their battle success.

### East Africa

### THE GREAT ZIMBABWE

Five Twin Jackal, Immortal Ancestor of the Zimbabwe

Crane Feller, Chief Zimbabwe Royal

DIPLOMACY: none

Most Zimbabweans stayed at home. All the 'good' territory had been conquered already. Unless you listen to the advisors who point to the rich land of Sakalava's former empire for northern expansion.

### THE BASOKO

Mamileke

DIPLOMACY: Luba(nt, but late neutral), Kikuyu(f), Mogadishu(fa), Kimbu(ea) later revolted), Brava(a), Gamo-Gofa(a, until it seceded)

Ramujet died and everyone rejoiced. Until someone discovered that Mamileke was not in Entebbe. The new king wanted Mwanza to be the capital, and favored Burundians. The Soko old chiefs made a big ruckus until they were chased off. Gamo-Gofa, Kimbu, Lamu, Luba and Mombasa took this opportunity to revolt. The Kikuyu ally was killed by the Mogadishu feudals. Kikuyu went friendly to the new Burund-Basoko.

### THE ZAGWE KINGDOM OF AETHIOPIA

Ansarto, Ras Jemo, King of Aethiopia

DIPLOMACY: Ennedi(nt), Darfur(nt), Kordofan(a)

The Ethiopians continued their Nile Road by building a bridge over the Nile to connect Dongola to Kerma. A new port, Duncunab, was founded along the Red Sea shore of Suakin. Its purpose was partly to keep an eye on the strange Hindus who have colonized Aswan. Ungawa died in 1335 and precipitated a succession crisis. It was resolved when supporters of Ungawa's bastard brother overthrew the guardians of Ungawa's son Ungada. There was many deaths in the royal compound. When Ansarto's men prevailed the survivors immediately swore fealty. It turns out that Ansarto's mother was a princess of the host of Kordofan. This host, in honor of the new king their blood-kin, allied with the Abyssinians. All 26,000 of them. The regions of Kordofan, Ennedi and Darfur converted to Coptic Christian.

## EUROPE

### Western Europe

### THE AR ROCH SULTANATE OF IEST

Ar Rod Abu'l Hashim, Governor of the Vermin Insects

DIPLOMACY: Al Hauts(t), Yemen(fa)

Lots of city improvements were built in Oujda, Siracusa and in Egypt. In Sinai, next to the Red Sea, Suez was built. Bari Suwayf in Faiyum expanded. The royal road was extended from Tripoli in Lybia to As Sidra's city Surt. The Aardvark went to Suessex on a secret mission. Trade by sea was revived with Basoko and Parthia.

### THE NORMAN KINGDOM OF SAXONIA

Edward III, King of the Saxons and of the Normans, Count of Blois

DIPLOMACY: Lothian(f)

The Saxons expanded ten of their cities, their universities and kept the new city growth clean. For grain shipments and other services, lots of money was delivered to Mahidia, Thaery, Andalusia and Francia. The king's spy network was gutted but no traitors was found in the purge. The regent De Stopol crossed the channel to rule from the winter palace in Cherbourg. He issued a decree prohibiting any new papal monasteries in his country so long as he had power. Connaught is cultivated.

## THE ALMORAVID EMIRATE OF ANDALUSIA

Marwan II, *Emir as Sevilla*

DIPLOMACY: Timiris(t)

Marwan approved the charter of two new cities. Agadir in Idjil and El Aaiun (that's right six vowels and two consonants, if you play 'Wheel of Fortune' you would go bankrupt before guessing) in Bojador. Both are ports. A postal road was then built over the High Atlas Range from Casablanca to Agadir to El Aaiun to Dokhla. Like everyone else, trade was started with the bizarre Chalukyias of Aswan.

### Italy

## THE KINGDOM OF LIGURIA

Reginald, *King of Liguria*

DIPLOMACY: none

Lucca was rebuilt.

## THE ROMAN CATHOLIC CHURCH

Boniface IX, *Bishop of Rome, Vicar of Christ, Servant of the Servants of God, Supreme Pontiff on the Universal Church*

DIPLOMACY: none

Pope Lucius IV let the rest of Europe slide in their wickedness. Apparently, the excommunication of a mass murderer was not received by the monarchs of most Christendom. The Educational Trust Fund was suspended for the time being. Lucius IV died in 1333.

## THE PRINCIPALITY OF SPOLETO

Giuliano, *Prince of Spoleto, Defender of the Faith*

DIPLOMACY: Puglia(ea), Trono(f), Apulia(fa)

The Spoleti moved further south to gobble up the Orthodox territory of the 'singing lizard Tarantum'. The allies still stood around. One of them died.

### Eastern Europe

## THE NORDIK KINGDOM OF THAERY

Elbert, *King of the Danes*

DIPLOMACY: Hordaland(aw)

Simon was a careful caretaker. He expanded sea trade activity and the navy. One fleet went to Iceland to re-discover a route mapped earlier by the Norse. Simon grew infirm and young Elbert took control of the north kingdom.

General Omev with 10,500 troops (his ships can only carry so much) shuffled back to Hordaland to deal more damage to the fake Christians there. The 7000 heathen defenders were crushed in battle but the military conversion failed. There wasn't enough manpower to do the job. And the Hordalanders knew it. The pagans uprose and chased the Thærrians back to their boats. That bane of Thaery, the Craven Hordel, is back. Omev returned to København and offered his resignation to the young king Elbert.

## THE CRAVEN HORDEL, BACK FROM THE GRAVE

Berkir

DIPLOMACY: Hordaland(hm), Romsdal(f), Opland(f), Trondheim(f), Trondelag(f)

To prevent future attacks, the pagan region of Norway have united.

## THE KINGDOM OF FRANCA

Ekhart II, *Panarch of Francia*

DIPLOMACY: Illyria(n)

The king was overtaken in a fit of madness. He disappeared from the palace with no clue to his plans. Bruto killed Bluto to become the 'acting' lord of the Franks. The illyrians revolted after their chief died. Prince Oswald was no longer welcome there.

## THE GRAND PRINCIPALITY OF WARSAW

Volazarn IV, *Grand Prince of Warsaw*

DIPLOMACY: Goryn(f)

Volazarn would not fire Wulharrik the Younger despite his excommunicate status. That he couldn't tell the difference between Christians and non-Christians made no difference. Wulharrik didn't even go to Rome as he was bidden to do. The populace wondered if lightning would strike the 'Genocidal General' down and level the royal palace in an earthquake. But none of these happened. After a while, crime increased, especially murder. Eventually in 1335, Volazarn proclaimed the Younger Wulharrik to be a national hero.

There were no more attacks from the Byzantines. New cities were safely built in Goryn (Mogilev), Moravia (Bmo) and Volhyna (Lvov). Volazarn guarded Wayness and Moldavia anyway.

## THE PRINCIPALITY OF NOVGOROD

Boris II, *Prince of Novgorod*

DIPLOMACY: none

The cities of Novgorod grew to 5 GPv and Pekov to 3 GPv. Sergey died after ruling over three decades. His son Boris is the second Boris to rule as Prince of Novgorod. Boris is a lousy administrator, a family trait. Courland is safe to travel in now.

## THE JEWISH STATE OF THE VOLGA

Salomon, *Emir of Great Bolgar*

DIPLOMACY: none

In a surprise move, Sultan Hunzal announced that he was a Jew. And surprisingly enough, Bolgar itself turned Jewish too. Then the army was scaled down to a small size and many synagogues were built in Bolgar for the Bolgar were really into this 'yid' thing. Don, Donets, Khazar, Murom, Suvar, Taman, Urkel and Yayik rebelled and remained Muslim. Jews were chased out of Khazar, Don and Yayik helped convert Mordva, Ryazan, Suzdal to Judaic. The generals were horrified and left the nation in a huff, except ibn Husit who attempted an assassination attempt against Hunzal. It failed. The government suffered some desertions. Hunzal then took the name Salomon, a Jewish name he was told.

Every Byzantine city was as clean as can be except for Belgrad in Bosnia, but that doesn't count. Although the merchants were as active as ever, the Byzantine ambassador staff didn't travel as much and ignored the doings of Europe. Despite its power, the Empire became more and more isolated, internationally. Trade was restored with Warsaw.

DIPLOMACY: Sangurg Host(a)

Subatoi's jaunt over the Altai range led him to the land of the Sangurg who were game enough to tag along.

## THE DAR AL ISLAD - ARBILIQ CALIPHATE

As Sa'id, *Kalifat Rasul Allah, Commander of the Faithful*

DIPLOMACY: Fars(fa), Qatar(t)

In Khuzestan, the port of Horns got built. The Caliphal Road that ended in Basra was stretched to Horns, the new city. Seven other cities were expanded. Trade finally got started with the new Basoko more money disappeared from the treasury to go to the 'Black Tower'. As Sa'id has denied everything and killed those who dare question.

## THE SHAHDOM OF PARTHIA

Arsooes III, *Shah of Parthia, Emir of Merv, Archon of Bactria*

DIPLOMACY: Karatou(a), Makran(nt), Yezd(nt)

After so much hubbub, Ahuramazda returned to Kirman again and crushed them. A real garrison was left there. The way was open to Makran and the outside world. Trade contacts with lost, Aethiopia, the Harayuk and Chalukya was re-established.

## THE GHORID SULTANATE OF AFGHANISTAN

Omar, *Sultan of Afghans*

DIPLOMACY: none

Ushrusana revolted again. But Ferghana and Pamir stayed as did the outpost Ghebel Gharib.

## THE HARAYUK RAJPUT EMPIRE

Beljanapaia, *Khan of Khans, Master of Kaunaj*

DIPLOMACY: Jats(fa)

Upon the sandy rocks of the Andamans was built, Kohanpuram, Harayuk's outpost city. From Kohanpuram trade is now possible with Java and Chokiang. Chalukya sent some cereal.

## THE CHALUKYA MANDALAM

Dantidurga II, *The Great Muta*

DIPLOMACY: none

Chalukya's strange new trade outpost had to advertise to be noticed. Men with bunny ears visited the Mediterranean ports extolling the virtues of Mandalam goods. The appeal of nose rings, silk turbans and monkey meat have a long way to go in Christian Europe. Trade finally started with everyone. Chalukya's merchants are richer and fatter now. To honor the new found wealth the slave economy was torn down in favor of guilds - caste based of course. A royal road was built connecting Cochinar in Kollam to Tangora. Yasinditya married Bitter Aunt Sai and died the following month. There is no peace for the woman or for anyone associated with her.

## THE RASTRAKUTA EMPIRE

Chanda II, *Emperor of Manyakheta*

DIPLOMACY: Bhutan(a), Sikkim(t)

In Kamarupa away from the rivers, the city of Rangpur was built. Then Faraja passed away. His son, Chanda II, was in Bhutan talking trash with the high chief.

### South-East Asia

Merca: 5mwe, 5mc, 10mhi, 20mi, 10mw

## THE KINGDOM OF PAGAN

Krawrahta, *King of Pagan, Maharaja Myanmar*

DIPLOMACY: none

A recent bad harvest forced the monarchy to release the rice reserves to the people.

## THE AQUARIUM OF JAVA

Halibutimsutra, *King of the Spice Islands*

DIPLOMACY: Utara(ea), Mindanao(c), Palawan(fa), Palau(nt), Sulawesi(ea)

The Javanese continued to pick up the little islands. Walleyemsutra died of too much salt water in 1335. He had a fry, Halibutimsutra, too young to rule. So his uncle Pikimsutra is the regent for now. Sulawesi had made it known to the world that they are economic allies.

### China

## THE DAI VIET GUO

Pang Vandiem, *Wang Dai Viet*

DIPLOMACY: Kweichou(ea), Preikuk(a)

The Viet sent silver to Ciao in hopes they would share their military secrets with them, but there was no answer. The elite army expanded in hopes it'll be enough to stop the Mongols.

## THE HIDDEN DRAGON OF CHEKIANG

Quan Ciadoi, *Celestial King of Chekiang*

DIPLOMACY: none

The Chekiang really expanded their elite troops. Then the fresh faces headed north to face the horde doom. There were attempts to find the Mongols in the steppes somewhere. But none of the scouts could pin point them. Many agents were lost and killed in the process. The great army was shifted to Bao Ding. But their commander, Koei Luang, died of the Asia Flu. The navy of Sou Yi shuttled in reinforcements and moved out the Gurvan to Korea. He guarded the sea lanes. But he 1335 Ungzhang's liver exploded, a rare affliction that kills Chinese heroes. His young, inexperienced son Ciadoi is the new Emperor. Traders along the silk road report the Mongols are near Karakocho.

## THE CIAO CHINESE KINGDOM

Quo Yu

DIPLOMACY: none

The Ciao did not protest the increased Chekiang presence in their country. They just let it all happen.

## GURVAN ANSHAN

Shutson

DIPLOMACY: none

The Gurvan got extra silver from Chekiang but not Ciao. They departed the Ciao land to restore order to their own. 8500 of them arrived by boat to Sunto first. The rest followed by land and stopped in Parhae, where they can keep watch on all their territory, yet help out their allies.

## THE MONGOL KHANATE

Temujin, Ghengis Khan

DIPLOMACY: Stigham(f), Singing Host(f), Sangurg horde(f), Xao Ongut(f)

Temujin pulled up his stakes and led his mighty horde northward. Later, they were prowled in Mongolia attracting the remainder of the free hordes to their great army. Now that all hordes of the steppes are united, the Mongols are poised to do something big. Hanging from each of the million or so horses are rats in cages.

Sunlight on the Moon unlike so many old king, didn't die, he just slipped into the ocean. His son, Whisper of a Cloud in the Sky was killed by a shark. Silverlon is dead. Blackbear is chief. 3000 raw clams were delivered to Wyoming. Taposa was abandoned.

## LAKES WYOMING OF ILLINOIS

Hawkeye

DIPLOMACY: Ojibwa(t)

In Sangamon, the Lakes Wyoming started making measurements for a port city along the Great Snake. It'll be a while for it to be built, though.

Merca: 15mi

## MANITOWISH

White Rain

DIPLOMACY: Tolowa(nt)

The Manitowish elders considered the Acorn Growers intrusion into Tolowa to be an act of war. So the young chief Warbird with 13,000 wooden warriors, 12,500 naked archers and 7500 wandering braves in bearskins headed south, hooting and hollering. Tolowa was compelled by force of numbers to repudiate the Napa folk and rejoin the Manitowish. Then the war party struck into Pomo and forced tribute after defeating a local group.

Then they went into Yokuts itself. This was defended by 18,000 men. They were fighting for their home but their king, Merced, was not good at counting coup. So they withdrew into Nihlekt after losing more than half their men. The Napa capital was a grueling place to fight and all the inhabitants chipped in to help their king. But Warbird was able to hunt down the remainder of the Napa army. But Merced had disappeared. After killed a half of the city's inhabitants, Yokuts was at last pacified. The treasury was captured but no ex-Napa bureaucrat wanted to work in Manitowish. Some 18,500 brave men died exacting revenge on the Acorn-heads.

## THE ASSOCIATION OF ACORN GROWERS OF NAPA

Merced, *Chief of the Miiwok*

DIPLOMACY: no effect

DIPLOMACY: Heta(f), Guayaki(hs)

Winky Dink while playing golf died when a spiked ball beamed him. His son Twinkle Dink combined wild dancing with coconut cider. It was too much - he blew up. Black Duck was killed by a 'fræ Guayaki' terrorist. Twinkle Dink's son Sizzler Toad wants to get Guayaki back for murdering the field fort guards.
