What is Tax Adjustment? On the order form there is a line called Tax Adjustment. This is the extra GP you'll get if you decide to overtax or the less GP is you want to tax less. This line is necessary because your income has already been multiplied with the listed tax rate for the National Revenue. If you want to adjust the tax rate from the LISTED PERCENTAGE on the Stat Sheet, all you need to do is figure out the difference in GP and put that in the Tax Adjustment line. Otherwise you leave it blank.

Government Type Maximums: The effective government stat maximum for Imperial nations is as follows: BL, your Tech Level minus 1; Infra, two times your Tech Level. All nations start as Feudal monarchies until their BL or Infra exceeds 1 then they become Centralist Monarchies. Centralists will become Imperial if their BL or Infra exceeds 3. There is no way for an Imperial government to exceed its maximums. Oligarchies are formed if an Imperial nation blows up. Republicanism is only possible is there are several social upheavals. These rules come from the 5th Edition Rulebook

Cargo Capacity of Warships: The Unit Builds chart showing the CARGO Capacity of Warships is incorrect and is inconsistent with other parts of the 5th Edition Rulebook. The Cargo Capacity of Warships and Elite Warships for all Culture Types is 0.5 CARGO per warship point.

LORDS 10 UNIT CONVERSION

Each point of cavalry and infantry (light or heavy) represents 500 fighting men. A transport or warship point = 5 ships with 100 men aboard. A siege point = 5 siege towers or 50 cataputts or 500 sappers. A war elephant point = 50 elephants ridden by mahouts. A field fort point = 5 forts manned by 100 men each. A wall point = 10 feet of wall ramparts. The guard unit = a thousand of your empire's toughest, most gnarty

West Africa

Mercs: 10mc, 10mi

THE AKA'MURRID EMIRATE OF FULANI

Mustafa II, Emir of the Fulani DIPLOMACY: No Effect

Stuck in his own capital city with the face of the enemy in plain view outside. Maleek did what he could do to strengthen his position. The army was expanded and the walls strengthened. If Gao is to fall she will take every single Togonad with her. Maleek died in 1345. Only an underaged son, Mustapha, was eligable to succeed him. Due to isolation the claim on Galam was lost. A Togo trouble maker failed to stir up rebellion in Mali.

THE NIGER BASIN WAR

Togo vs. Fulani, lest

The early part of the 1340's saw a stand off between Togo and Fulani forces. There were a couple of attempts on Kutoba's life but they were a miserable failures. One murderer, a Berber, tripped as he made a lunge against Colonel Kuta. The following day, discontented Gaoti opened the gates of Gao, inviting the Togo to come in and finish the Fulani off. Both Kutoba and Kuta saw this as a trap. For one thing, the Togo would be forced to fight in the close quarters of a city against a mostly cavalry force that nearly equals their own invading army in numbers. Furthermore, the 10,000 Saharan mercenaries joined the 30,500 Fulani soldiers for the Fulani had outbid Togo two to one for their services. The fate of the traitors who had opened Gao's gates was not pleasant. They were killed by the Fulani as rebels. Those who escaped to the outside were killed by the Togonads as enemies. The Togonads waited for the navy to come by so that Gao would fall to a passive siege.

Not a chance. Togo Captain Gumbani arrived to Gao's port with 60 reed boats. 5 of them defected to the other side to join 30 wooden ships. The Fulani navy headed by Falel attacked and defeated the Togo ships. Gumbani's ships retreated down the river in

disarray. Gumbani himself was killed in the sortie

Standoff continued for the next year until early in 1343 when 8000 elite mixed Mahidian cavalry arrived from the Sahara Desert (about 2000 had died along the way, the rest were weary from the lack of water) and made a good account of themselves as they were surrounded and torn apart. Kutoba lost 2000 heavy infantry in this skirmish. The lestian leader, known as the 'Bromo Roach' escaped back into the dunes. There was no further activity in the remaining two years. Even during the Mahidian attack, the Fulani army did not leave their capital.

THE SUPREMACY OF TOGO

Kutoba

DIPLOMACY: none

Having lost the intiative, the Togo warriors were now griping about the tedium. Some of them wanted to go home, camel stew gets old after awhile. An old Fulani prince, Crecrum, tried to convince Kuta to revolt. This was a futile effort. Crecrum was exposed as an agent provokatuer and was tormented by the common soldery after he was tied to a log. The old noble died of maltisatment inside of a week. Muslim preachers trying to convert the army were laughed at and were petted with rocks. Some even got the log treatment, or the ant thing. The allied army of Mossi left Songhay and forced tribute from Dogamba. 4000 of the 7500 died in this adventure. The Mossi were reinforced with siege and heavy infantry and returned to Songhay to be bored.

THE RANTUKINGS OF KONGO

Akashua, King of Ba-Congo DIPLOMACY: Owando(nt), Nyuzu(nt), Mitimbe(fa), Okoyo(nt), Yaounde(ea),

Etosha(t), Lunda(nt), Sangbe(fa), Benin(f)

The Kongo expanded Hyambo, Cabinola and Port Kachunk -all to 3 GPv. There were many political agreement with the inland tribes. Once of these, the Mankim, were eager to join the Bakongo but no one showed up to their place. Akashua's eldest son Shokona died. Either Akashua's other sons: Ungawi or Janban or Shokona' boys Kambele and Betulanga could be appointed the next heir. Choosing one would alienate the others, however.

DIPLOMACY: Kimbu(ea), Luba(I), Gamo-Gola(ea), Mombassa(nt)

Mamileke visited the Kimbu, got them to go for the highest control status they could stand and went home. The young king gave his brother Cahrile a government job. On his first day on the job, Cahrile stabbed himself with a poison stick and so died of toxins. If only these Soko guys had longer life spans. Lake Tanganyika block trade with the Bakongo.

THE ZAGWE KINGDOM OF AETHIOPIA

Ansarto, Ras Jemo, King of Aethiopia

DIPLOMACY: none

Ganeti, Dunqunab, Artoli and Tobruk were expanded to increase trade and to sooner cultivate the wild grasslands. Nobody had to be killed.

UNIX AN ROCH SHELANALY OF FEST

At Rod Abu'l Hashim, Governor of the Vermin Insects

DIPLOMACY: Al Hauts(ea)

The Africans upgraded their entire standing army to elite form. War was declared on the heathen Togo and some young troops went dune surfing on their way to the battle site. Bromo Roach returned carping that the Fulani didn't keep their part of the bargain. Prince Al Binou, a bit of a fop, hobbled to Madina and visited Mecca, something his twin brother hasn't done yet. A royal road was built connecting Fez and Almoravid Casablanca. The Almoravid themselves connected Toledo to lest's own Madiera. Only one more link has yet to be built ot make trade safe from Oran and Oulda. Palma and Bani Suwayf are larger cities. The Saxon Monarch shipped 300,000 gold dinars. The money prompty disappeared. It is probably the reason why no one's seen the Aardvarks for awhile.

CIVIL STRIFE IN EUROPE!

Saxonia vs. Neustria vs. Franconia vs. the Papacy

Even as he prepared for war against the Saxons, Richard de Stopol the Tyrant of Normandy, evaded several assassination plots. To join the mighty Norman Batallion, all of the merchant shipping was broken down so that the sailors - along with the youthwere drafted into the army. Thus the Neustrian force was swelled from a 210,000 man force to an amazing 337,000. This was a large force that he assembled, the largest in all Europe. The Villian heard tell of the Papal excommunication.

'I am denied the ear of God because I am suspicious of Papal motives? I am no tool of any secret cult. I am my own king. Perhaps the Pope himself should be excommunicated!"

Having rallied the army into a frenzy. Richard set off on the war path that would gain the Villian's entrance into infamy.

Meanwhile in London, the young king Edward sought revenge against his former policy maker. 210,000 plus of mixed light and heavy equipment, infantry and cavalry in equal proportions. All these were shuttled across the English Channel in the Spring of 1341. The transport fleet laid their achors outside the harbor of Bruges. A small boat sailed up to Edward's flag ship and he talked to its pilot. It seems that the Villian had escaped all attempts on his life. Edward returned to London and considered other plans. There would be no landing in Flanders. There was no way that untested Saxon troops would be risked against superior arms and leadership.

To the south, the daring and brave Duvier acted. Leaving the navy behind (they cannot be demobilzied into infantry) and after a brief misadventure in Auvergne, Duvier and only 2500 soldiers dodged the Devil's Army and won for his king the Poitou and Brittany. In Vannes, he was joined by Farmingham and Phillip of Rochester. And they all wondered if they'll be able to stay on the continent much longer.

As the first order of business, De Stopol moved his capital to Tours. Then his force nabbed Orleans defeating a small pocket garrison. Then to everyone's suprise, including that man with the funny hat, he turned against the Francians who had cut trade. Burgundy was wasted and were forced to pay tribute. Swabia rebelled from Francia and offered to joined Neustria if they were spared from looting. In Bavaria, the Francian King Ekhart II and his son Bruto waited. They could not believe what had just happened. Only a year before Ekhart had laughed at the Saxons for their misery.

"Is this the final split?" mocked the Franken King, "What act could Francia do that would keep the Saxons forever bound? In no way would the Francians come to the aid of a dying empire.

But in his face marched 60,000 knights with lances, 67,000 cavalry men with javelins, 58,000 heavy Gallic swordmen, 151,500 Norman style archers. Nearly the entire Francian military stood by their royalty. But the 38,000 German knights, 39,500 Teutonic rangers, 15,000 heavy infantry and 12,500 light infantrymen were slain and the 300 ballista were broken by the invading army. Only 40 catapults and the Dynamic Diskord Legion accompanied the Franken King inside the 150 foot walls of Munchen city. Captain Dietrich von Broheg fled to Prague. Oskar von Zankel went by road to Carinthia. The Norman lost only 38,000 swordsmen. 75 towers and the citadel of Earcano were destroyed before Stopol turned his attention to the Francian capital.

In the dawn of March 20th 1345, trumpets sounded and immediately the King of Norman began besieging the city, throwing stones and arrows at the defenders, building ladders and ramrods. The sheer mass of besiegers broke the already sour nerve of the Francians. Soon the walls were busted open and no defenders were left inside the city. The Neustrians went wild and sacked the whole town. The treasury was captured as was much of the library and the royal jewels. King Ekhart and his supporters were lynched during the sack. Those inhabitants who survived were allowed to leave by road to Wyst. As a result of this great victory, Richard Stopol crowned himself King of 'France'. As dark clouds rose above the ruined town, King Richard died and left a legacy of war and destruction.

AMOKAL TO ROBING KARROK THI

Edward III. King of the Saxons and of the Normans, Count of Blois DIPLOMACY: Poitou(t), Brittany(f)

A lack of courage may have Edward's undoing. But the Neustrians themselves have bungled things. The Neustrians have destroyed a potential ally, though they wavered in their convictions. Two bishops from Rome have come to help the Saxon King

THE NORMAN REMODDER OF MERSTRIA

Gerald le Creusot, Norman King of Neustria and of the French DIPLOMACY: Orleans(t), Swabia(nt)

At the French capital of Tours, the oligarchs consulted amongst themselves as to who would replace the excommunicated King Fichard - in the face of a papal threat of a new excommunication for any man who dare succeeds De Stopol. They considered rule by committee until Pope Boniface VIII died in 1345. Then they elevated one of their own to rule as king. As a condition of stewardship the leading Fatimids withdrew the ban on new Papal monasteries

Connaught revolted due to distance. All overland trade had stopped with the lack of international recognition.

CHY ALMORATED EMPRACY OF AMPARISHA

Marwan II. Emir as Sevilla DIPLOMACY: Senegal(nt)

In exchange for lots of cash (420,000 gold dinars) the Andalusians shipped 80,000 tons of wheat and one favor to London. Kazmadina expanded to 3 GPv. Dokhla, Agadir, Casablanca and El Aaiun grew to 2 levels each. Royal roads built by both Andalusians and Africans connected the two Emirats in both Spain and the Mahgreb. At Kiffa is now rat tree and freshly scented with the sweet aroma of lilac.

Italy

CHE THE DOM OF THE HEIA

Vandallo, King of Liguria

DIPLOMACY: none

The Ligurians built so many city and region improvements they ran out of room to improve upon. Reginald's old ailment killed him at the age of 55. Son Vandallo took over. The new Ligurian lord is still a bachler.

THE ROMAN CATHOLIC CHURCH

Gregory IX, Bishop of Rome, Vicar of Christ, Servant of the Servants of God, Supreme Pontiff on the Universal Church

DIPLOMACY: none

The Church ignored the Neustrian prohibition and built an abbey in Normandy. The abbey in Champagne became a full fledged monastery. A Cathedral was consecrated in Spoleto

With some dubious evidence, Richard de Stopol was excommunicated 'automatically" because he was "an agent of the FFF". The Neustrian "nest of vipers" was not interdicted, but everyone stopped trade with them any way. The Saxons were supported with extra clerics. They also received the lions share of the substantial EDU fund. Boniface VIII passed on in 1345. The new pontiff elected took the name Gregory IX.

THE PRINTIPATIVE OF SPOTETO

Isaco, Prince of Spoleto, Defender of the Faith

DIPLOMACY: none

Like the Ligurians, the Spoleti built up some of their public works. Giuliano then died of dust inhalation. Isaco is the exalted new prince.

Eastern Europe

Merce: 30mc, 10mi

CHE REPHRENCE OF SCHRIA

Oskar von Zankel, Grand Doge of Wyst

DIPLOMACY: Giulia(h), Illyria(t)

One of two Francian successor states. The Styrians have set themsleves as a republic with the Von Zankel clan at the head. Prince Oskar control Giulia, Carinthia, Friuli, Illyria, Gardo, Lessini, Piave, Retiche, Slovenia, Switzerland, Trentio, Tyrol and all cities and town within. Ditomar of the Eltas supports Von Zankel and holds the road approach to Carinthia against both the Neustrian French and the Bohemians. The old Francian navy is in Styria's control.

CHY HORRES THIS DOM OF CHATRE

Elbert, King of the Danes DIPLOMACY: none

The Danes took a hostile stance against the Neustrians immediately, but didn't clash. They watled for the effects of various secret manuevers and the Saxons to do their thing first. The Hammer of Tor headed to the English Channel to help out. Both Avente and The Hague grew to 4 GPv each. Captain Pele, exploring the icy route to Greenland spotted a floatilla of Saracen boats in the same waters as he. The mariner sailed to them and hailed them because they looked like they needed help.

"Stay away, " They finally said in Danish, "Sick we are. Quarantine "

So Pete turned around and left them be. Eventually they vanished over the horizons. Pete himself was lost to sea when a nighty ice storm capsized his last longship. Trade with Saxonia was restored by sea.

CHE TRANSISH TENSEDA OF BUNEAUA

Dietrich von Broheg, Panarch of Francia

DIPLOMACY: Bohemia(h)

Von Broheg from Bohemia held on to Austria, Bohemia, Melseen, Thuringia, ddau. Franconia. Hesse, Alsace and Champagne. The Devil's Army Nordgau, Franconia, Hesse, Alsace and Champagne. separated the Bohemians from their Republican brothers the Styrians. Dietrich wants to get back the Francian jewels from the Neustrians.

THE THIS BOARD OF TRANSPA

The Francians fell at the hands of Neustria. The Panarchs have gone extinct. The Neustrians now claim the legacy of Charlemange.

THE GRAND PRINCIPALITY OF WARSAW

Volazam IV, Grand Prince of Warsaw

DIPLOMACY: none

Volavam built some storage bins to place his accumulated wealth in. He personally guarded his treasure not trusting someone else with it. Wulharrik went back to Warsaw and confessed to the Archbishop there. The Archbishop instucted him to head on to Rome, but Wulharrik died before he could do so.

THE PRINCIPALITY OF NOVGOROD

Valerus, Prince of Novgorod

DIPLOMACY: Muscovy(fa), Kursk(hs)

Boris II ruled until his death at age 58. Valerus cleanly took over. Kotlas had been colonized to (1/3) Roman Catholic. losop was killed by the heathen Kursk

THE TEWISH STATE OF THE VOLCA

in a vision, Salomon saw a beautiful new land beyond the icy islands that Theory had discovered. He asked his people to join him and did. All the Jewihs inhabitants of Bolgar, Ryazan and Suzdal loaded onto newly built transports boats to escape persecution.

Not everyone could fit. A portion of the government had to be left behind. Aboard the 325 transports, the Volgars salled up the Volga-Onega River system to the Guil of Finland. From there they headed to the Shetlands and braved the uncharted waters beyond. 75 ships were lost in a storm near Iceland. They ere last sighted in bad condition by Danish navigators in 1343 heading toward Vinland. That was the last any had seen or heard of the Jewish Volgars.

The Byzantines ruled their vast dominion in peace. Two cities were built. Ariana in Temesvar and Bucharest in Wallachia. Both are Danublan ports. An Imperial Road was rebuilt going from Nicepolis in Thrace through Katerini to Heracies in Hellas

THE DAR ALISLAM - ARBILIO CALIPHATE

As Sa'id. Kalifat Rasul Allah. Commander of the Faithful DIPLOMACY: Taman(ea), Hadramunt(nt)

The Caliphal Road continued down the Persian Coast from Siraf of Mand to Hormuz' Bandar. Homs, Siraf, Samarra, Acre and Antioch were all upped 1 gold level. Sea merchant traffic increased too. As Sa'id died, so the 11 year old al Ma'mum has become the new Commander of the Faithful.

THE SHAHDOM OF PARTHIA

The death of Arsoces III was it for the Parthian Empire. It blew up into four ieces. Dasht Kavir, Dasht Lute, Gurgan, Kuldja and Shadad have rebelled. The Kara-Kum desert has consumed the region of Transoxania. Khwarzim region is now (4/4). Uzbek is now (1/6) desert region. Bactria is now a (3/7) region. Jowzjanan is now (2/6). Makran increased to (2/6).

THE PARTHID SHAHDOM OF RAYY

Isma'il, Shah of Rayy DIPLOMACY: Kumis(h)

Arsoces' underachieving son, isma'll, was in Rayy when the whole Shahdom There was still some who wanted the old family to stick around. So lema'll set up a new Shahdom to Kumis and took Tabaristan, Zagros, El Burz, Daylam, Arran and Georgia for his cause. Trade still exists with Novgorod, Thaery, Warsaw and Byzantion. The Parthids have converted to Shi'a.

THE BAITED EMIRAT OF MERV

Mahmud al Bajj, Emir of Merv, Archon of Bactria DIPLOMACY: none

The home government multineed against the Parthians and founded the Buijid Emirate. The main government and army, treasury and national force pool plus Jowzjanan, Khurasa:n, Kuhistan, Tabaristan, Khuttal, Soghdia and Bactria fell under Bajjid control. The 1000 Hoplites were stomped on by Mahmud's

THE KHANATE OF KARATOU

Funjuz, Khan of Karatou DIPLOMACY: Karatou(h)

The Karatou Khan straddles the north frontier. With Karatou, Khokhand, Uzbek, Kyzi-Kum and Khwarzim.

THE GOD EMPIRE OF CHAH BAHAR

Ahuramazda the Awesome, God Emperor of Chah Bahar, The Blazing Sceptre of All Known Earth, Might Master of Makran

DIPLOMACY: Makran(h)

Ahuramazda proclaimed his religion was Shi'lte, but he himself was very divine. But Chah Bahar got only Makran, Kirman and Laristan. Most of the merchant shipping started fishing to feed the city.

THE GHORID SULTANATE OF AFGHANISTAN

Omar, Sultan of Afghans

As Omar sat out the five year, Ferghana rebelled.

India

THE MONGOLOID INVASION OF INDIA

Mongols, Alanni vs. anyone unfortunate to dwell in India

Both Khans Subatoi and Holakshi were targets of many assassination attempts. In each Khan's case, somebody interposed in front of the horde leader, stopping the perpetrator from achiveing his objective. In the Mongol's attempts, the Khan of the Dangorr was killed. 12,500 Dangorr tribesmen left the alliance to turn Jats into a horde block. There was further defection from the Mongol camp when 53,000 cavalry joined the Dangorr to participate in their old way of life in Jats.

These Mongols who remained with Holakshi (still 580,000 of them, by the way) went up to Multan raided the region then the joined the Subatoi's 278,500 man Alan horde. Combined with them, the Hordes assaulted Lahore and sacked the city. Without further ado, the Mongol's troop support was fully paid before there were further defections. Further fundage was raised when a gold cac;he was discovered on an abandoned houseboat along the Sursuti bank of the Ganges.

Pretty much unopposed, the Mongols and the Alanni together (that's 858,500 cavalry when combined) thundered into Sursuti, Kuru, Jaunpur, Tirhut, Maghada, Kamarupa, VAnga and Nadavaria. In each region, the inhabitants scurried into the nearest walled city, or cave or tree as the equestrian storm passed on by. A path of destruction followed in their wake. Farmlands were trampled into dust. Villages were gutted with flames. Temples were desecrated. Of the cities encountered, Kotla, Lahore, Rangpur, Tamralipti and Bhagalpur were assaulted and sacked.

Of the cities, Bhagaipur proved to be the hardest job. The hordes actually had to earn their money for a change. A courageous (but foolish) leader defended Bliagalpur's 50 foot pallisades with a force of 12,500 cavalry and 20,000 infantry. When the Mongoloids crossed the Ganges, this pitiful force attacked and chopped down instantly in the water. With sheer force of gravity, the 858,500 nomads tore down the wooden walls and ran over the whole town. A few of the Mongoloids actually broke a sweat in this affair. The Rastrakuta capital was sacked and its treasury was plundered. The twin confederations took some time out and considered their next plan of attack. The rats in the cages got real agitated. Soon they'll have to be released.

THE ALANNICHARG HOST

Subatol, Khajan of the Alans DIPLOMACY: no effect

Subatol's men's nage got a good jog through the parks and avenues of the Ganges' north bank. All that loot and treasure that was lifted from the countryside was kept by the Mongols because they're the bigger horde.

THE MONGOL KHANATE

Holakshi Khan

DIPLOMACY: White Sangurg Horde(f)

Holakshi was an effective political force in South Asia. Nothing could stop his 'strip' tax policy.

THE HARAYUK RAIPUT EMPIRE

Nagavijaha, Khan of Khans, Master of Kaunaj

DIPLOMACY: none

The Mongoloid sweep through the valley was bad for business. People didn't go out of town as often. Farms were shut down or went bankrupt. The 25,500 heavy cavalry and 190,000 regular cavalry that had long been the backbone of Harayuk martial strength linked with 80,000 Burmese troops and 17.500 mercenaries to make a stand in Machada. But not against the Mongols, Bellanapala and his allies hid within the 150 foot lumber walls of Patna as the

A lot of heavy cavalry were hired and were kept near the capital. Money shipped from the Orient was squandered rapidly. Bitter Aunt Sai finally got the death she desired - She drowned in the Indus River after she suffered a seizure. When Dantidurga called up his sister, Zinzetta, for government service, she killed herself. His daughter, Baid, would rather be toseed in front of the Mongol horde. She ran away - probably to join the Mongols.

THE RASTRAKUTA EMPIRE

Sinuma, Emperor of Manyakheta

DIPLOMACY: Sikkim(a)

The Mongol rumble through Kamarupa and Vanga were devastating enough with the sacks of Rangour and Tamralipti. When they attacked Nadavaria itself the main Rastrakuta army was atomized and the capital fell. Sinuma's government collapsed and his treasury failed. But the Rastrakuta Empire did not buckle and fall. The King had been in Sikkim all this time, mindlessly renegotiating the alliance with the prince there.

China

THE DAI VIET GUO

Pang Vanvoa, Wang Dai Viet DIPLOMACY: Kwelchou(t)

The Vietnamese cut trade with the Gurvan and built mass public works. Aid was given to Chalukya as moral support against Mongol terror. A royal road was built that would connect Thanglong with Taili. It is not yet completed. By marrying Princess She, the Baron of Kweichou has become a family member.

THE HIDDEN DRAGON OF CHEKLANG

Quan Cindoi, Celestial King of Cheklang

DIPLOMACY: Luzon(c)

Free from the fear that gripped China, the Cheklang Dragon ordered their troops back home for some serious rest and relaxation. Celebrations occurred spontaneously and officially all over the country. What was good for China was not good for India so a long term loan was sent to Chalukya in hope that'll be enough to keep them around. The navy patrolled around the Pino Islands looking for any signs of Java intragenence. Field forts was demobilized to help build public works. Chienkang, Zhuzhou, Chiangling and Yixing expanded. All except Znuzhou (to 6 GPv) are now 7 gold levels each. A severe famine caused much starvation, despite the saved food reserves. Chlangling, Jao, Zhaoti, Yixing and Chunking suffered population losses

Warnings against Amago interferance in Chinese affairs and against Java meddling in Chinese and Indian doings were vocalized by the Dragon Emperor.

The Japanese were quiet and peaceful. Some new rock gardens were opened up in Toyama. They were scenic and serene. A babbling stream of water flowed through it from an unknown source.

THE EMPTRE OF THE STORM

Roots that grow Deep in the Sand, Storm King, Emperor of the Middle Kingdom DIPLOMACY: none

The Storm People watied patiently for the Empire to be really rich. Sand of the beach is getting more yellow.

THE AKETTA IMPERIUM

Anka, Sorcerer-King of the Aketta

DIPLOMACY: Toowomba(ea), Pechua(ea)

Sular died in 1345. Anka took the post from then on. Kadinah's now 7 GPv

Bearded White Men vs. Redskin Savages

After capturing a woman who knew the tongues of all the people, they got back on their sea boats and sailed along the coast to warmer climes.

Katerine expanded. More trails were demarked in Algonkin. Mohawk came back, again. Funny ships followed the coast. They never took to the shore except at isolated coves

THE CHOWAN SUPREMACY

Macqua, Chief of Chowan

DIPLOMACY: none

Skor died and the Chowan suffered a dynastic failure for no one wanted to see the eight year old Macqua take over. Texas and Cheraw revolted. Men with hair on their chins were signted off the coast on large, wooden cances that can hold entire villages. At times a small craft would visit a coastal village, trade metal for supplies, and leave. One time they asked through a woman interpreta the way to Cahokia. Fishermen directed them up the Great Snake.
