Four Year Turns, In Effect Right Now: Lords 10 is now switching to 4 years per turn. The full tax rate drops to 80%. Troop Support, Government Support and Project Support also drops to 80%. Intel Support & Religion Support remains as before; this is because they are now being used onace every four years instead of once every five vears.

Another Migration Restrictions: Any region settled by tribe points or colonized within the past 30 years (a generation) may not participate in a migration.

Saved Gold and NFP: If the Saved section (at the bottom of the Order Form) is left blank, I'nn going to assume that you are saving 0 NFP and 0 GP. I warn you now.

LORDS 10 UNIT CONVERSION

Each point of cavalry and infantry (light or heavy) represents 500 fighting men. A transport or warship point = 5 ships with 100 men aboard. A siege point = 5 siege towers or 50 cataputs or 500 sappers. A war elephant point = 50 elephants ridden by mahouts. A field fort point = 5 forts manned by 100 men each. A wall point = 10 feet of wall ramparts. An artillery point = 5 guns aind assorted men.

Mercs: 20mi

THE AKA'MURRID EMIRATE OF FULANI

Seldez, Emir of the Fulani

DIPLOMACY: Kebbi(f), Kurfei(a), Khalem(n), Boure(nt)

Seldez's men worked some time to restore credibility to his empire. Kebbi and Kurlei were toasted. Representatives made advance discussions with the Boure and Khalem. One setback occurred when General Mohammad move half the garrison out of pacified Yoruba. The Afro Pagans there rose in rebellion against the depleted guards and became a free land. Elsewhere, the protectorate leaders of Nupe converted spontaneously to Islam. Nupe is now a non-resentful tributary.

THE KINGDOM OF BORNU

THE SULTANATE OF IEST

Ahmad

DIPLOMACY: none

lest grew to 5 GPv and in Misr, the Red Sea port of Suez was built. Liguria gold found its way to Ahmad's coffers where it was forgotten.

Ahmad was out. He took that navy of 110 elite warships, 640 regular galleys and 50 corsairs and invaded Corsica. The Dulio Principate had nothing to stop the Mahidian landing troops. 20,000 Muslims stomped on the 5000 Catholic islanders. Corsica was pacified and ulama started to convert these infidels (before it was too late) to Islam. Because an insufficient garrison was left behind, Corsica rebelled killing 3000 unlucky troopers.

The Cavaller wented more boats. So a portion of the army was demobilized. Now internal trade expanded. Rouers grew to 5 levels of human habitation. Barcelona has 9 gold points and Sete. 8.

THE ALMORAVID EMIR ATE OF ANDALUSIA

Marwan II, Emir as Sevilla

DIPLOMACY: Arguin(f), Gambia(nt)

All cities in the Western Emirat saw an uptick in population. A new town, Toledo, was built in Talavera, around the cladel Al Baralaha ("The High Hawk"). The navy expanded but their job was to dog up the harbors. Prince Hishram died young. The new heir was Uthmar, Hishram's brother. Marwan II has just passed his 120th lunar year birthday. I—le has outlived all his children and some of his grandchildren. New trade started with Alghanistan and Irland.

THE LIGURIAN KINGDOM OF ITALY

Marcus, Rex Lagobardum

DIPLOMACY: Santanu Kingdom(hostile, but still trading)

All of Liguria's port cities except Assevana grew. The ports were then jammed with all kinds of trading ships. Erbeto journeyed to the excetic kingdom of San Tana and tried to tell them that the Kiragdom of Calucca (A slightly less exotic place) was all right. The San Tana thought Erbeto to be an evil presence and evicted him. Erbeto advised Marcus thant Liguria should convert to Hindu if they wish to exert influence in this distant Beand. Converting to the worship of firehellspawn? Not in the Pope's back yarrd. Gazil found nothing interesting in the backwoods of Liguria and Provence. Here knows, though, something fishy is going on there. People are disappearing.

THE ROMAN CATHOLIC CHURCH

Benedict X, Bishop of Rome, Vicar of Christ, Servant of the Servants of God, Supreme Pontiff on the Universal Churces DIPLOMACY: none

Kelsida. Great Princess of Warsaw

DIPLOMACY: none

The Queen wanted Status Quo, and boy did she get it.

THE KINGDOM OF THE BALTS

Vladimir, King of Baltica, Prince of Novgorod

DIPLOMACY: Kalinin(nt), Kaluga(nt)

I'wo cities expanded: Novgorod and Reval. Tver is cultivated. the money received from the Papacy was used to build public works.

THE BALTIC PRINCIPATE ON THE VOLGA

Nikolai Yaskusk, Prince of Kubishev

DIPLOMACY: none

The Christian outpost on the wild frontier zone was unmolested.

THE DIHAJ HOST

Tagaktu, Mighty Servant of Allah

DIPLOMACY: Suvar(t), Taman(t)

The Dihaj Lord made Suvar feel welcome to join his growing nation. The Taman ally died and willed his land of Tagaktu.

ASIA

The Middle East

Mercs: 10mhc, 10mc, 10mhi, 10mi, 10ms

THE PSECHULEN ROMAN EMPIRE

Demetrios Psechulen, Imperator Romanus Orientalis, Despot of Crimea **DIPLOMACY: none**

Catholic influence grew in Crimea. Demetrics didn't stop the effort.

THE EMPIRE OF ABYDUS

Theopilos Comnenus, Imperator Romanus Orientalis

DIPLOMACY: Rhodes(a)

He who restored the Comnenii to power (at great cost), died in his sleep (unusual for this part of the world). Theopilios became the new Emperor of the Abydos realm. Corinth increased to its 5th level. Trade with the Ghorids started now that Ghor's Nile port is viable.

AL RAHJETALUDEMIRAT

Mohammad

DIPI OMACY: none

Mohammad moved his court and government to Chalcedon, which coincidentally, converted to friendly this turn. So now Optimaton has become the Rahjetalud homeland. Overseas trade started with the Abyssinians, Crimeans, Styrians and Poles

THE DAR AL ISLAM - ARBILIQ CALIPHATE

An Nasir, Kalifat Rasul Allah, Commander of the Faithful

DIPLOMACY: none

Karbogha guarded Crete, on the watch for any hostile intent by sea. Having seen none, the old captain died of 'sea fever'. The road network was improved o, making the Arab lands easy to rule. From acres, the Caliph's Highway extended to Jerusalem. Three cities grew to 7 GPv: Acre, Basra and Antioch. Adana in Cilicia is up to 6 GPv.

THE KAHINDARID SHAHDOM OF RAY

Al Kahindar, Shah of Rayy

DIPLOMACY: Dasht Kavir(nt, but it would revolt), Khurasan(fa), Khokhand(t, it dropped out)

Yuhana spent his last years mending bridges with the Silk Road princes. He promised to rebuild or expand cities but that was son't seen as credible to the 'Great Devastator'. Yuhana's death threw the Sultanat into a turmoil for he was the last of the Parthid Princes. Dasht Kavir and Khokhand reveled. The new strongman, Al Kahindar, was formerly Yuhana's lieutenant's aide de camp.

THE GHORID SULTANATE OF AFGHANISTAN

Bayezid, Sultan of Alghans

DIPLOMACY: Tukharistan(fa), Khuttal(a)

The Ghorids restored their Nile for tress in Ghebal Gharib. Italian and Greek goods arrived from this way station to the bazaars of newly increased Chah Bahar and Antizani. Shah Bayezid wouldn't believe the rumors he hears that Ghebal Gharib wants to declare their irredependence.

India

Mercs: 10mwe, 10mhc, 30mc

THE HARAYUK RAJPUT EMPIRE

Rupika Isanavara, Khan of Khans, Masster of Kaunaj

DIPLOMACY: Maghada(fa)

The main Harayukarmy of 25,000 cavalry was allowed to be commanded by foreigners (much to the soldiers' disdeuin) to fight in the Burmese Civil War. No one ultimately showed up to take therm away. The fighting men were relieved. What was left (very few troops) were led by Prince Nayakaditya to pound on the rebel Sulduri. With only 12,000 infantry, Nayakaditya defeated the Suldur king's army. Only 1 500 men were lost in battle. Khairpur and all Suldur was pacified. Kaunaj grew to become the largest city in India.

THE SANTANU KINGDOM OF GOBLIGUK

Santunu Sholalita II DIPLOMACY: none

A demon-lord from the Occident attempted to subvert King Sholalita. He would not convert to the devil-worship and forsake the mantras. What shivered Sholalita the most was that the demons did what the Chalukya told them to do. So trade was cut with Chalukya.

THE CHALUKYA KINGDOM OF BANAVASI

Chalukya Saivehesa

DIPLOMACY: Andhra(a)

A note was sent from Sholalita that unification was not possible. Kerala has become cultivated.

THE SHAGUNGA EMPIRE

Dhruva Shagunga, Emperor of Konoralic

DIPLOMACY: Chela(1)

Dhruva hirred some mercenaries jurest to stand around. It was an easy job but it wasn't much fun. Sakalujula couldn't find a wile for Dhruva so the king married in Konorak at the end of 1404.

THE ASSAM KINGDOM

Pyinmana

DIPLOMACY: none

Pyinmana's Brahmaputra trip made him the hero of the Burmese War. His ex-boss, U Pyaw, wasn't so fortunate. Goodwill won't last forever - Pyinmana has to get back home.

South-East Asia

Mercs: 5mwe, 20mhi, 20mi, 10mw

THE KINGDOMOF PAGAN

Binnya Ran's mutiny has left the co-untry in ruins.

THE MYANMARI KINGDOM OF KWA

Hkonmaing, King of Kwa, Maharaja Myzanmar

DIPLOMACY: none

Histonmaing became the new Kwain: King, but his capital is Pendash.

CRISIS IN INDONESIA (1385-1404+)

Burmese Civil War: Assaura, Burma vs. Kwa, Vietnam Java War: Chekiang, Vaestnam, Makassar vs. Java

Long Joe Mo wanted to build new troo-pes but couldn't without his capital city, which was still Prambanan. he went ahead with flais plan anyway without them, hoping to get reinforcements later. In Johor King Tanin-granwe Umon was wounded by a pro-Binnya assassin. Kaw Man interposed himself and was killed by the agent. He saved Umon's life. The second-in-command Hkommaing; took command of the Kwain forces. The Kwain evacuated Johor and Perak, expecting the Makassar to take over these provinces, but they reverted to Java control.

A Victnamese army marched from Tomakin to assist the Kwa faction.

The Chekiang fleet of Quai Chang grantrolled the Riouw Sea and sailed up the Prambanan River to Srivijaya searching four the Java fleet. Since they weren't in either location (they had moved to the ferry arrows between Lampung and Sunda), the Chinese sailed for home. The Vietnamese transportes led by Quoi Udon also went home. They were disappointed at the Chinese lack of adventure.

The Assamese King mad common cause with the Burma faction and combined forces in Burma. They marched south to contest Kwa territory.

In September, the Java fleet of 250 warships engaged the Makassari ships: 110 chuanbo and 85 barges. Supported by the 2100 catapults and some scouting, the Javanese sumk the Makassari fleet ensuring a safe ferry crossing to Sunda.

The Javanese army landed in Sunda to face a superbly trained and equipped army. Despite favorable terrain and weather, the Javanese force of 2100 catapults and 10,000 cavalry were mauled by the Makassari Colonizers: 10,000 elite heavy infantry, 5000 regular heavy infantry, 11,000 Makassari and Kedahi regular light infantry, 1000 elite heavy cavalry and 5000 elite light cavalry. A battle of two days ended with Long Joe Mo's flight with only 1500 cavalry to the protective hulls of the Java navy. Long Joe's assistant Chahandrasam had been captured. Fomoi of Kedah, with no army left, rebelled and became another neutral region.

Victorious, Zhen Ju of Makassar colonized Sunda after its pacification making the region a Mahayana Buddhist region. Prince Zhen Yao colonized Kediri facing some resistance and converted the land of Mahayana Buddhist with some settlers from China and Vietnam. Both areas have sizable Hindu populations.

Meanwhile up north and a little bit west, the combined Assam-Pagan force stumbled into the meeting point of the Vietnamese and Kwain armies.

"Hey, look who shows up."

"Saves us the trouble of finding them."

King U Pyaw led 9500 Assam cavalry, 14,000 garrison shield men, 13,500 garrison javelineers to battle. King Binnya Ran fronted 5000 Pagan cavalry, 5000 swordsmen and 13,500 Ava spearmen. It was a good size army if they didn't have to deal with 20,000 Vietnamese armored and silk clad elite cavalrymen, 22,500 Kwain cavalry, 10,000 elite Viet legionnaires, 22,000 Kwain shock troops, 250 mercenary war elephants, 10,000 mercenary irregulars and 15,000 Mon archers. The assemblage could have been larger but 10,000 mercenary swordsmen were 'convinced' to take a vacation with a bribe from Binnya Ran. Still, the battle of Kram Hill (April, 1402) put an end to Binnya's rebellion and broke Assam's military might. with the loss of outly 12,000 skirmishers, the Kwain and Viet armies obliterated the Assam and Pagan marchers. An additional 5000 men died when the elephants ran amok. Kings U Pyaw and Binnya Ran were captured and were trampled to death.

The Kwain commander, Hkonmaing, and Viet general Guang Noi headed through Thaton (leaving it alone) to take Pegu, storming the walks of Bassein and the Pegu citadel to gain control of the land.

The Makassar colonized Pajajaran with the remainder of their transport colonists and made the old Java homeland their homeland with Prambanan the capital. The Aquarium finally made Lampung their new homeland with Srivijaya as the de facto seat of power.

Late in the year, a landing of 4500 Assumese marines led by Pyinmana snuck into Kwa by way of neutral Kedah and captured the Kwain capital, Golden Portals. King Umon was killed (for he had stayed behind) and the Kwa state suffered a collapse. 1444

Hkonmaing ignored the fall of Golden Portals and captured Pagan, decapitating the already reeling Burma Kingdom. By pacifying Burma, he gained a new government to replace the one he just lost. Hkonmaing made himself King at Pendash, Mon's city. Pyinmana, himself, was acclaimed the new King of Assam, but he had to get back home to claim his title.

Without a Burmese government, Arakan, Kayah, Korat, Lampang and Thaton became independent kingdoms.

THE AQUARIUM OF JAVA

Long Joe Mo, King of the Spice Islands

DIPLOMACY: none

Chahandrasam, Long Joe's first lieutenant is a prisoner of the Makassar in Sunda. At least Perak and Johor came back.

THE VICEROYALTY OF MAKASSAR

Zhen Ju, Viceroy of Makassar

DIPLOMACY: none

After their latest land victory over Java on land, the Makassar threw a big party in Prambanan. The Hindus were no shows.

China

Mercs: 5mehc, 5mec, 10mehi, 10mei, 10mew

THE DAI VIET GUO

Triang, Wang Dai Viet DIPLOMACY: none

A generous gift was sent to the Kwa to assets their war against the rebels. An army joined them led by Guang Noi. Cluoi Udon returned to vent his frustration over China's reluctance to go for the kill. Thanglong expanded to 7 GPV. In 1404, King Nguyen perished. There was an orderly succession for Triang's promotion to boss.

THE HIDDEN DRAGON OF CHEKIANG

Quan Zinco, Celestial Emperor of Chekiang DIPLOMACY: none

The Dragon cemented their presence on the Quan Islands, building the port (all cities in circled-islands have be ports) of Manling in Leyte. Zhaoti and Chunking expanded and public works were built everywhere. Quai Chang returned to port in Linan and boasted the Java. fleet is no more. The old admiral's balloon was burst when intelligence reported threat a Java fleet sank the Makassar

fleet in a place that was neither the Ricuw Sea nor Palembang River. In the forests of Human and Hwai, pain-immune brigands terrorized local constables.

THE CIAO CHINESE KINGDOM

Hiacian, King of the Northern Prefectures
DIPLOMACY: Liaotung(ea)

Japanese samurai by the millions swooped down from the sky and devoured all life from Ciaco's green hills. A foreign invasion, no, an affectionate term for the latest locust swarm. The Prince from Yen hasn't moved an inch since he arrived in Bao Ding decades ago.

THE NIHON EMPIRE

Tenno Komyo, 85th Emperor of Nihon, Descendent of Arnaterasu

DIPLOMACY: none

A lot of trainsports got built but they weren't doing anything.

THE ESTATE OF AKATA

Akata-no-Dachimosa **DIPLOMACY:** none

From the castle city of newly cultivated Mutsu (lhoru), the Akata clan dwell. Neutral Nigata has also become cultivated.

THE EMPIRE OF THE STORM

Fire Between the Fixed Stars, Storm Kirng, Emperor of the Middle Kingdom

DIPLOMACY: none

Recent bad harvests have encouraged more men to fish.

THE DARK LAND OF AANA

Kuveras Shadowsinger, Holy Sahdus of the Akettu, Master of Kabbadi

DIPLOMACY: Eha-Rana(f), Hweah(t)

Eha-Rana became friendly through no effort by Djimiks.

THE AKETTA IMPERIUM

Janggala, Sorceress-Queen of the Aketta

DIPLOMACY: Nokama(a)

Janggala kept the ancient tradition alive. Taree got cultivated by the influence of Init.

THE NEW WORLD

The Grand Massif

Mercs: 10mi

BONNY KINGDOM OF MERCAIN

Angus II, Elder King of the Land DIPLOMACY: Micmac(nt)

Duncan city got bigger. Weasels were outlawed, especially Eastern Sea Weasels. Ferrets and polecats also got Ibashed. Mink? well, they got skinned. Cavalry Count: 40 years.

THE CHOW ANSUPREMACY

Massapagua II, Chief of Chowan DIPLOMACY: Delaware(f)

The new sachem moved to the high-land estate to rule his extensive land. Cavairy Count: 40 years.

THE HOPEWELL CULTURE

Snow Fox

DIPLOMACY: Cherokee(fa), Muskegon-(f), Osage(f)

White Tree, Chieftess of the Manitowish Empire

DIPLOMACY: Klamath(hs)
