**DIPLOMACY:** none

**THE KINGDOM OF GALAM**

Tuhimbo

**DIPLOMACY:** none

Being a buffer state is the pits.

**THE SUPREMACY OF TOGO**

Juguntala, *Supreme Oba of Togo*

**DIPLOMACY:** lfe(fa)

The Togonads made sure that lfe was theirs. A port fortress was built along the coast sporting the name, 'Ivory Hill'.

**THE BINIKINGS OF KONGO**

Poaruta, *King of Ben-Congo*

**DIPLOMACY:** none

Ebola was murdered in 1425. 4000 men deserted and joined the 'Real Kongo'. Ebola's teen-age son Poaruta is the new king.

**THE BANTU KINGS OF KONGO**

Lassa, *King of Ba-Congo*  
DIPLOMACY: none

Lacking the military power to confront the Benin-Kongo, Mirawa and his men leaned on their spears. In 1428, Mirawa caught one of those weird African diseases and died. His son (Lassa), was underage which inspired Mbeke to attempt a rebellion. He was stopped by Shabaz who led 10,000 and crushed Mbeke and his followers. Likasi had rebelled and the claims on Nyuzu and Elosa were lost. Prince Rambo never came home.

**THE GREAT ZIMBABWE**

Gristar Glim, *Chief of Zimbabwe, Holder of the Five Twin Jackal Chair*  
DIPLOMACY: none

After centuries of just sitting there (That's what Five Twin Jackal did), the new lords of Zimbabwe made plans to simplify the political situation in their area. 50,000 infantry, some armored with wooden planks, got on board 225 ocean going craft and paddled their way to Sakalava. The Hindu people there had too many strange notions which wasn't kosher for the Judaic Zimbabwe. So after their army of 7000 or so men were flattened by the Shona invaders, the land of Sakalava and the inland city of Calcutta were converted by threat of physical harm (or actual physical harm) to Jewish. Lion's Claw and Bid Bort had done their job and felt a sudden desire to go home. This they did in 1428.

Meanwhile, Glistar Glim with some 47,000 men marched north and forcing tribute from Ruvama and Kilwa, conquering Mombassa. The Muslim region weren't thrilled over this but they haven't been well organized since the days of Basoko. In 1428, Lion's Claw died. Lion's Claw had no progeny so Gristar Glim got the king post. Water was poured and six cities grew (Bur Sudan, Luxor, Dongola, Dunqunab, Djibouti and Massawa). Atbara and Kordofan were colonized to 2 Gpv each. Prince Gobbu with 20,000 troops defeated the Harar pagans and then military converted them to Coptic Christian.

**EUROPE****Western Europe**

**THE SULTANATE OF IEST**

Nahdaf, *Sultan of Mahidia*  
DIPLOMACY: none

Iest and Palma grew. There was little activity in the land. While poking around in Almoravid Al Kiffa, Ahmad was suddenly paralyzed. He died at the end of 1428. The treasure chest from Sevilla was passed on to Baghdad.

**THE ALMORAVID EMIRATE OF ANDALUSIA**

Marwan II the Everlasting, *Emir as Sevilla*  
DIPLOMACY: Takrur(f)

The road system in Andalusia got very dense. A royal road was built from Extremadura to Talavera then to Salamanca to Leon, connecting with all those other roads. Another got built in the far south from Dakar to Takrur. Timiris was degraded to tributary. Money was sent to Baghdad by way of the Iest to continue the help the 'beleaguered Dihaj'.

**THE NORMAN KINGDOM OF ENGLAND**

Alred, *King of England*  
DIPLOMACY: Dyffed(t), Gwynnedj(t)

While more Saxon infiltrators in the populace were exposed and expunged, Helston grew to 7 Gpv. Wales was bought for two pennies.

**THE NORMAN KINGDOM OF SAXONIA**

William (IV) the Wise, *King of the Saxons and of the Normans, Count of Blois*  
DIPLOMACY: none

Verburque, Le Mans and the Count of Auvergne with some troops disturbed Church lands searching for secret activity. It was all a waste of time, the Catholics has done a fine job keep the bad guys out of Europe.

Barcelona and Sete grew.

**THE LIGURIAN KINGDOM OF ITALY**

Arturo, *Rex Lagobardum*

DIPLOMACY: Romagna(a), Apulia(fa), Calabria(nt), Switzerland(nt)

Arturo went south and got somewhere in the diplomatic talk. He made up for his lack of charm with generous gifts of gold. Napoli, Genoa and Livorno grew in size.

**THE ROMAN CATHOLIC CHURCH**

Peter III, *Bishop of Rome, Vicar of Christ, Servant of the Servants of God, Supreme Pontiff on the Universal Church*

DIPLOMACY: none

The Church took an active hand in combatting the newly Catholic Balts from the Muslim threat. Cardinal Gobouth sailed from Kiev to the Baltic Sea and then into the Volga River system to co-ordinate the effort. The Pontiff otherwise made sure they would be no more wars in Europe.

**Eastern Europe**

**THE REPUBLIC OF STYRIA**

Lif Untero, *Grand Doge of Trangau*

DIPLOMACY: Alsace(f), Bavaria(a)

With Papal aid the Styrians invested in their shattered economy. Citherione and Berlin grew. New merchant fleets were approved. In 1428, young Stefan Charofai died. The Unteros, having been out of power, returned to power, with their patrician Lif as the new Doge.

**THE NORDIK KINGDOM OF THAERY**

Stevan Firehand, *King of the Danes*

DIPLOMACY: none

The Danes kept watch on their waters. Shipbuilders were making new and interesting designs for better ocean going vessels.

**THE GRAND PRINCIPALITY OF WARSAW**

Devin Boshnik, *Great Prince of Warsaw*

DIPLOMACY: none

Devin died young. His brother, Lazam, seized the throne promising a return to Polish prosperity and power. Civil Unrest at home caused food riots in Warsaw and a portion of the treasury was stolen.

**THE KINGDOM OF THE BALTS**

Ivano II, *King of Baltica, Prince of Novgorod*

DIPLOMACY: Muscovy(a), Prussia(t)

General Feodor Mamou went to Viatka to get the Baltic East Army and get back to Kama Bolgar. There, they awaited the arrival of Cardinal Gubour who told mamou that it was time to invade Suvar. The Baltic East Army was ready but the VolgaBaltic Army chose not to come. These folks were too unprepared and scared to be involved. So 30,000 cavalry (light and heavy) and 10,000 infantry (archer & shield) marched in Suvar. Suvar was under Dihaj domination and Khan Maniak at the head of 48,500 Dihaj nomad cavalry and 9500 Vabol allies plus 2000 Suvarese were not going to let the Catholics get away with it. The first round of battle was a stalemate. The Balts were outnumbered yet did possess a tactical edge based on army composition. They inflicted 21,000 casualties while only suffering 16,000. But the Dihaj host was without an end. The following battle was a disaster, the Papal chief Gubour ordered a withdrawal which was disorderly. Many Baltic cavalry were slain in the pursuit. Only 3500 riders escaped, and they're in Yaroslav. Mamou died in 1428 from winter illness.

DIPLOMACY: none

The Volga Balts could have made the difference if they were willing. The Pope sent money to them anyway.

**THE DIHAJ KHANAT**

Maniak, *Mighty Servant of Allah*

DIPLOMACY: Suvar(f)

The Dihaj defended the Suvar but lost many men doing so. The Vabol reduced to the old men, women and children want a place to settle at. Maniak's son Suleiman died of measles.

# ASIA

## The Middle East

**Mercs:** 20mc, 20mi, 10ms

### THE PSECHULEN ROMAN EMPIRE

Maximilian Psechulen, *Imperator Romanus Orientalis, Despot of Crimea*  
**DIPLOMACY:** none

Maximilian returned to Crimea. He needed to raise money for troops support, so he laid off many government flunkies. Cherven had spontaneously given their support to the Psechelens. Zaporozhie rebelled and joined the Abydos regime.

### THE ROMAN EMPIRE OF ABYDUS

Romanos V, *Imperator Romanus Orientalis*  
 Kleopatra, *co-Empress of the Roman Empire*  
**DIPLOMACY:** Zaporozhie(nt)

The Romans were into building things. Heraclea and Constantinople were expanded. Work began on an imperial road to Bucharest.

### AL RAHJETALUDE MIRAT OF RUM

Ibn Mohammad, *Emir of the Roman Lands*  
**DIPLOMACY:** none

Greek spies wounded Ibn Mohammad in his bath tub. A Byzantine leader tried to rouse the Christians of Paphlagonia and Galatia into rebellion. A Christian Orthodox minority had appeared in Lydia.

### THE DAR AL ISLAM - ARBILIQ CALIPHATE

An Nasir, *Kalifat Rasul Allah, Commander of the Faithful*  
**DIPLOMACY:** no effect

The Iesti and Andalusians somehow sent cash to the Caliph so that An Nasir could financially assist the poor embattled Dihaj. A new city, Harran, was built for Arbiliq. Basra, Antioch, Tabriz, Sarid, Timova, Najaf, Baghdad, Samarra and Siffa grew. Georgia was colonized to 2 Gpv.

### THE BENU QAKHIBI

Sharif Tufail

**DIPLOMACY:** As Summan, Timamat, Dahy, Ad Dahna, Jabal Shamar, Al flaj, Al Bayad, Safajah, Al Hasa, Yamama, Qatar(all nt)

27,500 camel (Dromedarian, one-humps) riders from Timamat have gained token dominion over most of the Arabian land.

### THE KAHINDARID SHAHDOM OF NISHAPUR

Shivar Al Kahindar, *Shah of Nishapur*

**DIPLOMACY:** Khwarzim(t), Khokhand(t)

Not so veiled threats convinced the Khwarzim walis to pay homage to Shivar. The Khokhand were also scared into submitting. Shivar rode his way to Bactria but hadn't the time to punish the rebellious Dasht Kavir people.

Bubla was fired. He did not leave gently. Other subordinates were unhappy over this move.

### THE GHORID SULTANATE OF AFGHANISTAN

Bayezid, *Sultan of Afghans*

**DIPLOMACY:** none

The Ghorids saved their resources from their future.

## India

### THE HARAYUK RAJPUT EMPIRE

Rupika Nayakaditya, *Khan of Khans, Master of Kaunaj*

**DIPLOMACY:** Jats(ea)

A port facility was built in Jats. Now if only the Arab traders would notice.

### THE CHALUKYA KINGDOM OF BANAVASI

Pulakesin IV

**DIPLOMACY:** Surashtra(a)

Holikow the Great took some flowers to Surashtra. That was the beginning of a wonderful new alliance.

### THE IVASH ORISSA KINGDOM

Kunara V, *Lion Lord of Orissa*

**DIPLOMACY:** Chela(fa)

Aniruddhan was rebuilt since Assam was safely theirs.

### THE MAHIYANA BUDDHIST MISSION

Karmasungi, *Abbot of the Relics*

**DIPLOMACY:** none

The senior priest of the Mahayana sect sailed with Pynmana and 100 warships around the Mallaca Strait into Chinese waters. In the Penunjuk Wan, he was accompanied by Chekiang escort boats (some of the warships joined the Chekiang navy). They all arrived in 1428 at the recently built Twin Pagodas, the 100 foot tall Buddhist Temple. There, Karmasungi deposited the manuscripts and relics, making the place a holy city. Pilgrims in China now had a better place to go to instead of risking the mountains and bandit tribes.

## South-East Asia

### THE REALM OF BURMA

Hkonmaing, 'The Old General', *King of Burma, Maharaja Myanmar*

**DIPLOMACY:** Thaton(t)

It was good that Thaton became friendly when their allied leader passed away.

### THE VIET VICEROYALTY OF MAKASSAR

Zhen Shing, *Viceroy of Makassar*

**DIPLOMACY:** Medan(ea), Ajeah(a)

Zheng Shing had a miserable time dealing with the dingbats who lived in Sumatra. The Ajeah, for instance, did not buy the dynastic marriage deal pointing out that Shing already had a wife (and some children). Still, their city Aceh was expanded to 4 Gpv which has gotta count for something. The Medan objected to the color of his headband. All the hard work paid off in the end with new alliances in this miserable island.

## China

**Mercs:** 10mec, 10mei, 10mew

### THE DAI VIET GUO

Yan Tao, *Wang Dai Viet*

**DIPLOMACY:** no effect

Most folks stayed indoors and got caught up with the paperwork. Vung Tau hadn't any children yet.

### THE HIDDEN DRAGON OF CHEKIANG

Quan Chunzhu, *Celestial Emperor of Chekiang*

**DIPLOMACY:** Kedah(fa), Tungchuan(a)

The Dragon Road network was pushed to the undeveloped southland. From Jao the road connected to Linchuan of Kanchou. Work started with the pike to Nanling but cost projections were too low and the job hadn't been done. The city of Chienkang was blessed with the presence of the most important priest Karmasungi who brought the benevolent spirits of Buddhism to China.

### THE CIAO CHINESE KINGDOM

Wolai, *King of the Northern Prefectures*

**DIPLOMACY:** Bandaot(nt), Anshan(nt), Ningsia(a), Wu Hai(a)

The Ciao Realm worked to solidify their power internally, though in North Korea, the effort backfired. A road was built connecting Chiniao to Kaifeng by way of Tsainan. A port city was built in Tsainan (Wileng). Another was built along the Yellow River in Shentung (Fulao).

### THE NIHON EMPIRE

Tenno Suboko, *86th Emperor of Nihon, Descendent of Amaterasu*

**DIPLOMACY:** none

The Empire awaited the execution of their plans to expand their influence.

## Pacifica

**Mercs:** 10mi

### THE EMPIRE OF THE STORM

Wild River, *Storm King, Emperor of the Middle Kingdom*

**DIPLOMACY:** none

Stormbringer grew one last time to great size. Waverider and Cloudbearer also gained urban dwellers.

### THE DARKLAND OF AANX

Ruveras Shadowsinger, *Holy Sahdus of the Akettu, Master of Kabbadi*

**DIPLOMACY:** none

Not really.

**THE VAKAS IMPERIUM OF THE AKETTA**

Vakas Lomaradu, *Sorcerer-King of the Aketta*

DIPLOMACY: Temora(hs), Pechua(a)

The famine forced the government to be scaled back. Temora was not happy to see Tibe.

**THE NEW WORLD****THE THIRD VISIT OF THE VOLGARS****THE GREAT DEATH UNLEASHED (1416-?)**

The Death spread casually into Sokoki, Caranook, Potawatomi, Missouri, Sangamon and Illinois. From Illinois, the entire Chicagoland was affected. Girmsby, Bath, Old Bluff, Chicago, Joy Juice, Alton and Jonas have been destroyed. Caranook has reverted to wilderness. Illinois is steppe again. Amazingly, Sokoki is still cultivated.

**The Grand Massif**

Merca: 10mi, 5mc

**THE COLONY OF DUICH**

Pytuthi Mac Duich

DIPLOMACY: Tunica(hs), Taposa(nt)

Pytuthi fortified his new home with field forts and a new port citadel along the Ohio River in Michigamea. He would be challenged twice for his homeland for none of the Hopewellian nations welcomed the Colony's presence. The first attack occurred around late 1425 when 4000 Illini clubmen attacked. Pytuthi thought this invasion insane. He had 25 stockades, 1000 crossbowmen and 5000 knights. The Duich were dug in, were fighting for their home, had the mobility and most important had much higher quality troops. The savages were utterly crushed. Only 500 Colonial infantry were killed. Two and a half years later, the semi-Danish Komlanders landed a party of 1000 heavy infantry and 4500 light archers. Again the same story. Not one invader survived. The ships they arrived by fled in panic.

While Fortress Michigamea stood strong, other lands were vulnerable. Miami was invaded and occupied by the Adena Confederacy. Figol check up on the non-Christian lands around him. Only Taposa was interested, even though (or maybe because) the Korn Prince Peter Massao was present. Wenro, isolated from home, rebelled.

**THE HOLY FLEET OF ST. PETER**

Vavia Harunao, *Representative of the Holy Pope of Rome*

DIPLOMACY: none

160 Papal ships arrived off the coast of Vinland (That is, they are at Vinland's beach. They do not control Vinland. Vinland is innocent). Their captain, Cardinal Visconti died at the end of the voyage. His number two man, the Legate, Vavia Harunao, is now in charge of this mission.

**BONNY KINGDOM OF MERCAIN**

Angus II, *Elder King of the Land, Sword of the Vanished Tribes*

DIPLOMACY: none

More troops were to be sacrificed in order to crush the Mac Duich. Adena was supposed to direct them. Unfortunately, they were neither expected nor wanted. They caught the smallpox and measles bugs in Cayuga and suffered great losses by the time they reached Erie. Only Alvin and 2500 (or the original 27,000) made it to Miami. The Adena leader told them to 'buzz off' and they did. They never came back home.

**THE BLESSED COUNTRY OF KORNLAND**

Peter Massao, *Jarl of Kornland, Sachem of Chowan*

DIPLOMACY: Muskogee(hs)

Brigham Grikuvinder made another long trip, this time to fight the clever Duich in their new homeland. He hadn't the battle skill that the Duich had. The Kornish were wiped out. The ships arrived at Taposa at the end of 1428 to relay the bad news to young Peter Massao. Peter, not a good diplomat, was unable to get anywhere in Muskogee and Taposa. He would need to get back home before his country fell into anarchy.

**THE ADENA CONFEDERACY**

Snow Fox, *Great Chief of Adena*

DIPLOMACY: Quapaw(c)

Snowfox searched the grave sites of his countrymen but found no treasure beyond a few feathers and beads. Blackhawk and Cagone attacked Miami with 10,000 regulars and 7500 auxiliaries and occupied the Christian land with little incident. No other army save the unwanted Mercains showed up.

**THE ILLINOIS CONFEDERATION**

Waterfall

DIPLOMACY: none

Soon after Running Dog's failed invasion of Michigamea, the Death came into Chicagoland. All cities were lost. The population could no longer support cultivation. Though his family died out, Waterfall survived and was still chief of Illinois and his subsidiaries: Croix, Fox, Kickapoo, Sangamon and Sauk. Noquet and Ottawa have become independent.

**LAKES WYOMING OF OGOKI**

Huge Elk

DIPLOMACY: none

The Lakes faction who stayed true to the old ways have been spared of the devastation, so far.

**THE SMOKE DANCER CULT**

Matthew Stonespirit, *Chief of Atakapa*

DIPLOMACY: none
